

- Capacity Building for Higher Education (ex-Tempus) Institutional collaboration projects based on multilateral partnerships between higher education institutions (HEIs) from Programme and eligible Partner Countries
- Main Idea: improve higher education quality in partner countries
- Activities:
 - Curricular reform
 - Improving quality of education and teaching
 - Improving management and administration of HEIs (including internationalization)
 - Developing of HE sector within the society (NQF, QA, knowledge triangle etc)
- Projects based on national and/or regional priorities





- Organization: consortium of two programme country HEIs + partner country (+ possibly non-academic partners + MoES in some cases).
 - National projects HEIs from only one partner country (min.3)
 - Regional projects HEIs from two or more partner countries from the same region (min. 2 per country)
 - Cross-regional projects HEIs from different regions (min. 2 per country)
- Applicant/coordinator could be HEI from programme or partner country
- Funding: 0.5 1 Mio Euro (salaries, travel, equipment)

CBHE projects – priorities for Iran

Education, Humanities (except languages), Social and Behavioral Science, Journalism and Information, Law, Engineering, Architecture and construction, Health, Environment, Security Services

- Governance, strategic planning and management of HEIs
- University services
- Equity, access and democratization of higher education

- Development of school and vocation education at HEIs
- University-enterprise cooperation

CBHE projects

• Evaluation process

- Technical evaluation eligibility, compliance with rules
- Experts' evaluation
- Short lists role of EU Delegation very important! June
- Final decision July/August
- Project start November or January

CBHE projects



- Evaluation criteria
 - Relevance 30 points
 - Quality of the project design and implementation 30 points
 - Quality of the project team 20 points
 - Impact and sustainability 20 points
- Detailed information in Guidelines

CBHE projects – success stories from Georgia



- Beneficiary from 1995, 77 Tempus and 29 CBHE projects so far
- Curricular reform: new study programmes for new professions

- International Credit Mobility (ICM): Opportunities for students, as well as for professors and staff of higher education institutions to undertake a learning and/or professional experience in another country.
- Organization: bilateral partnership between universities from programme and partner countries. Applicant is always university from the programme country. Application is sent to and evaluated by the National Erasmus+ Agency.
- Funding: travel costs + scholarship
 - Scholarships: 800, 850 or 900 Euro per months for students (depends on hosting European country)
 - Scholarships for staff: 140-180 Euro per day (depends on hosting European country)
 - Reimbursement of visa and insurance costs subject of negotiation

Student and staff mobility



• Characteristics:

- Student mobility can be in any subject area/academic discipline
- Eligibility: Bachelor (except first two semesters), Master, Doctoral students
- Duration of mobility: one or two semesters (3-12 months)
- Staff mobility
 - Teaching periods
 - Training periods (professional development)
- Duration of mobility: 5 days 2 months

• Specifically for 6-11 regions (including Iran):

Mobility for first- and second cycle students is limited to inbound mobility from Partner to Programme Countries. Outbound mobility towards these regions is only available at doctoral level and for staff.

- EMJMD high-level integrated international study programmes delivered by consortia of higher education institutions that award full degree scholarships to the best master students worldwide
- Organization: minimum three European universities apply together with a new master programme; if approved, they offer scholarships for students and staff

- EMJMD for universities you may be a full or associate partner
 - Full partners participate in teaching process and award a degree
 - Associate partners may participate in teaching and/or practical placements, but don't award a degree
 - N.B. No funding for development!





- EMJMD for students you may get a scholarship
- JMD programmes are opening call for applicants in September/October with different (!) deadlines
- Application rules may be different main requirements:
 - Bachelor degree, min. GPA 3
 - Internationally acknowledged certificate of foreign language
- Funding rules: travel costs and 1000 Euro scholarship per month
- N.B. No quotas!

- Aim: promoting excellence in teaching and research in the field of European Union studies
- Academic projects
 - Jean Monnet Module teaching one subject
 - Jean Monnet Chair teaching and researching EU
 - Center of Excellence providing full scale of EU expertise at academic level
- Collaborative projects
 - Networks Jean Monnet Networks foster the creation and development of consortia of international players (HEIs, Centres of Excellence, departments, teams, individual experts, etc.) in the area of European Union studies.
 - Projects Jean Monnet Projects support innovation, cross-fertilisation and the spread of European Union content.
