Values: Intellectual Freedom; Inclusivity; Service Excellence

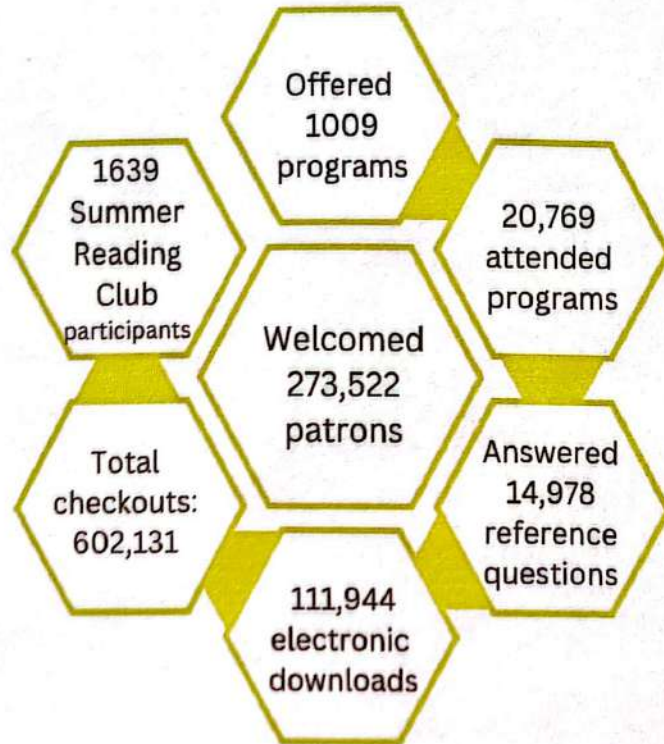


2023 Highlights

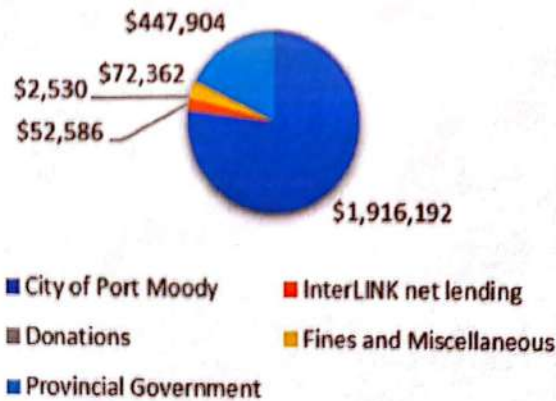


- We welcomed 4,802 Newcomer/ESL patrons to 224 programs: a 32% increase over 2022;
- Registered new library accounts for 1,812 Port Moody residents, and 1,434 non-residents;
- Added 14 additional patrons to our Accessible Services program and added 20 Envo Connect devices to assist patrons with visual, physical or perceptual difficulties to access library materials;
- Launched a video game collection;
- Hosted Red Buffalo Nova Weipert and Eden Fineday in our Indigenous Speaker series;
- In collaboration with the City's Environmental Services, created a circulating Bat Pack with books, a tablet, an echo meter and other items to help citizens detect and identify bats;
- Purchased reusable cloth mailing bags for interlibrary loans to reduce paper and plastic consumption;
- The Teen Advisory group, with programming staff assistance, held a Career Fair to connect teens with individuals working in unique jobs;
- Implemented a bookable talking room for patrons to have small in-person or virtual meetings.

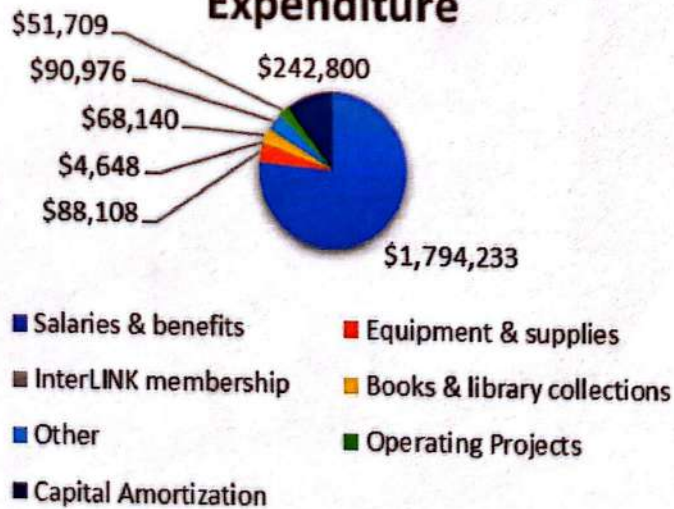

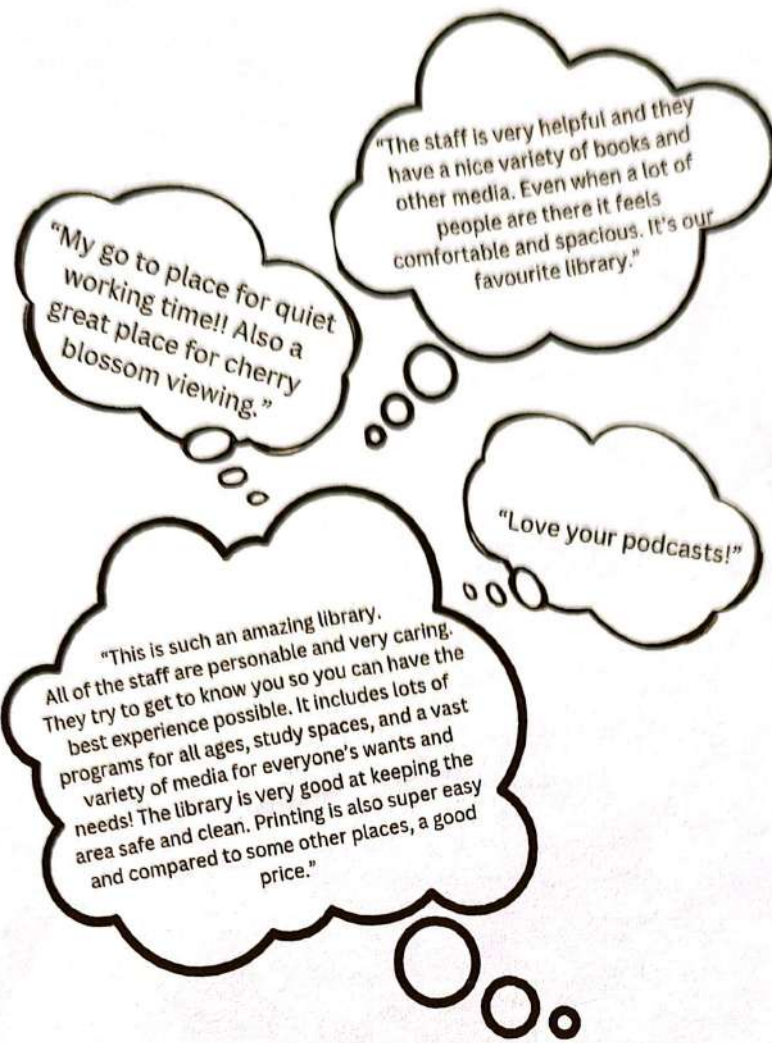


Revenue
